

### Man elongated cap with pattern "checkerboard"

Size: 54-56 cm



For knitting you need:

- yarn 100%; Merino - JULI, YARNA (50 g/175 m) - 3 skeins;
- needles № 3,5 and 4.

#### Density:

Rib 2x2 in a slightly extended form 20 stitches x 34 rows = 10x10 cm

The basic pattern "checkerboard" 22 stitches x 30 rows = 10x10 cm

**Important:** I was knitting in two yarns.

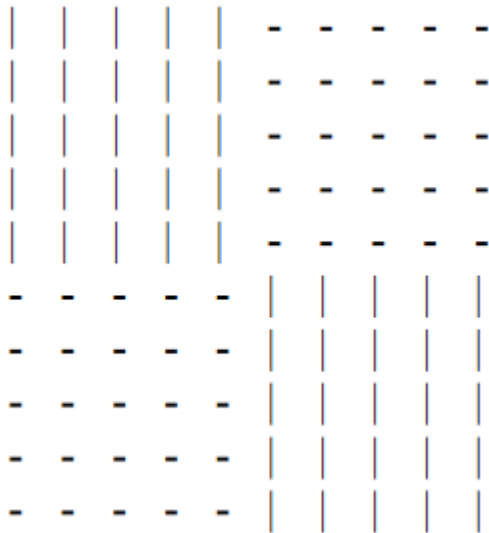
### Man elongated cap

Using needles № 3,5, cast on 112 stitches and knit the rib 2x2 18 rows = 6,5 cm



Then go to the needles № 4 and knit 54 rows (=17 cm) using pattern "checkerboard" (knitting pattern 1)

**Knitting pattern 1:**



| = knit (stitch)  
- = purl (stitch)



In general, you have 72 rows (= 23,5 cm) from the edge (where you're casting on).

In order to form the top of the cap, bind off every first row in the row 73: every 6th stitch, every 5th stitch, every 4th stitch, every 3d stitch, until there are only 6 stitches. Put together these last 6 sts and sew the cap.

### Female red cap

I was asked for the instructions for knitting the little red cap. I'd love to share. You need only a few hours to knit this charming cap.



**You need:**

- yarn (70% wool, 30% acrylic), 1 skein;
- needles № 7, № 10.

**Density:**

- Garter stitch 10 stitches x 22 rows = 10x10 cm
- Ridge rib 9 stitches x 16 rows = 10 x 10 cm

Cast on 57 stitches on the needles № 7 and knit 17 rows (=7 cm), using pattern “garter stitch”.

Then go to the needles № 10 and knit using pattern "Ridge rib":

- **1st row:** 2 knit stitches, 2 purl stitches, etc. Use 1 **knit** and 1 **edge** sts at the end of the row.
- **2nd row:** 2 purl stitches, 2 knit stitches, etc. Use 1 **purl** and 1 **edge** sts at the end of the row.
- **3d row:** repeat pattern of the 1<sup>st</sup> row

After 21 cm (= 41 rows) knit together from the edge (where you're casting on):

- **42d row:** Knit up 1 stitch knitwise (kwise). Then knit 3 stitches together (kwise).
- **43d row:** knit the row purl-wise
- **44th row:** knit 2 stitches together (kwise).
- **45th row:** Using working yarn, tighten remaining 7 stitches

### Cap and scarf with jacquard pattern

#### You need:

- Yarn (70% baby Alpaca, 20% polyamide, 10% Merino wool) – 3 skeins dark blue; 1 skein grey, 1 skein white, 1 skein coral, 1 skein turquoise;
- circular needles No. 4 (120cm);
- double pointed needles № 3,5; 4.

**Density:** 20 stitches x 27 rows = 10x10 cm

**Size:** S/M

**Head measurement:** 54-56 cm

**Scarf size:** about 15x136 cm

**Important:** ensure that the density of your knitting coincide with the specified one.

#### The cap:

Cast on 108 stitches on the double pointed needles № 3, 5 and knit 18 rows, using pattern “rib”: knit one, purl one.

Then take the double pointed needles № 4 and continue knitting. Knit 6 rows in dark blue yarn, then follow the knitting pattern.

After completing the knitting pattern, knit 6 rows in dark blue yarn.

After 68 rows (from the edge) for forming a top of the cap, do the following (*for convenience, I'm using pins to mark the stitches that I'm going to decrease*): \* knit two (2) stitches together, 10 sts knitwise, knit two (2) stitches together (slope left = slip 1 stitch, knit next stitch knitwise, knit the slipped stitch through the knitted one) \*\*, repeat from \* to \*\*.

Then there are 10 rows of decreasing in each Right Side Row. Tighten remaining 9 stitches and fix the end of the yarn on the Wrong side.

#### The scarf:

You should knit the scarf in width.

Cast on 270 stitches and 2 edge sts on the circular needles No. 4. Knit 4 rows in dark blue yarn, then follow the knitting pattern. After completing the knitting pattern, knit 4 rows in dark blue yarn.
